The President called the meeting to order at 2.30 pm. There was no quorum at 2.30 pm and the President announced that the meeting would be rescheduled at 3.00 pm in accordance with the Constitution. The meeting was called to order at 3.02 pm.

OPENING REMARKS

In his opening address, the Chairman said that the College had been consolidating the various College's activities such as the Undergraduate Teaching, Continuing Medical Education (CME) and Vocational Training in the past one year.

On Undergraduate Teaching, the House was informed that the College Vice-President, Dr Lim Lean Huat has been appointed a part-time adjunct lecturer with the Department of Community Occupational and Family Medicine (Department of COFM), National University of Singapore. The feedback from the students on the undergraduate posting was good. Chairman added that Prof Lee Hin Peng, Chairman for the SMC-CME Committee was very pleased with the good administrative work done by the College and the Academy of Medicine, Singapore in the SMC-CME programme.

Chairman informed the House that Dr Richard Ng, Chairman, Continuing Medical Education (CME) Committee was at the moment overseas. He commended the Chairman and the CME Committee members for their efforts in keeping the CME going.

The House was informed that for the first time, the College's financial position was in the 'black'. The House applauded Dr Arthur Tan, the Honorary Treasurer and Joanne Yap, Administrative Secretary for keeping the accounts healthy.

1 MINUTES OF THE 22ND ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON SUNDAY, 27 JUNE 1993

There were no amendments to the minutes. The adoption of the minutes was proposed by Dr Huan Meng Wah and seconded by Dr Leong Vie Chung. There were no objections.

2 MATTERS ARISING

The meeting went through the matters arising out of the minutes.

Dr Wong Heck Sing said that he was not formally informed by Dr Koh Eng Kheng for the further funding of the Albert Lim Award. However, Dr Wong said that his family would be happy to continue the funding of the Award if the rest of the families of the late Albert Lim had no objections.

Chairman informed that the House that during the last Annual General Meeting held on Sunday, 27 June 1993, it was agreed to change the College's name to "College of Family Physicians Singapore". The change was effective from 17 November 1993 after the necessary approval from the Registrar of Societies and the various government bodies were obtained. The College's Constitution had been amended to increase the Council Members to seven. The House welcomed both Dr Lee Kheng Hock and Dr Yeo Khee Hong who were co-opted into Council.

The House was informed that results of the survey on the "One Day Morbidity Pattern in Singapore" was compiled and it would be published in the October/December 1993 issue of the Singapore Family Physician journal.

Chairman informed the House that the College had submitted a detailed Memorandum on the *Advanced Training Programme for Family Medicine* to the Ministry of Health and the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, National University of Singapore. The Ministry of Health felt that for the time being, Family Medicine should consolidate itself before embarking on the Advanced Training Programme. The Director, School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, NUS, had no objections that the College coordinates the proposed Advanced Training Programme in Family Medicine. The College could continue to award the exit Certification for Family Medicine to its Diplomate members and doctors who have obtained the M Med (Family Medicine) degree and who have completed a programme of advanced training.

3 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE THIRTEENTH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1994

The following amendments were made to the Annual Report 1992-1993:

3.2.1 REPORT OF THE THIRTEENTH COUNCIL 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

Page 6, Para 3, Line 4

“Chairman added that the data could useful for research on the learning patterns of the doctors in Singapore”. The amended sentence should read as “Chairman added that the data could **be** useful for research on the learning patterns of the doctors in Singapore”.

Page 7, Para 1, Line 2

“On the question of the SMC Specialist Register, Dr Lim Kim Leong said that the SMC Specialist Register Committee had prepared a report for the Specialist Register earlier and this had to be reviewed again”. The amended sentence should read as “On the question of the SMC Specialist Register, Dr Lim Kim Leong said that the SMC Specialist Register Committee had prepared a report for the **SMC** Register earlier and this had to be reviewed again”.

3.2.2 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CENSORS 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

Page 7, Para 4, Line 1

“This M Medicine (Family Medicine) degree is recognised as entry to the exit certification programme of the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, NUS”. The amended sentence should read as “This **M Med (Family Medicine)** degree is recognised as entry to the **proposed** exit certification programme of the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies, NUS”.

3.2.4 REPORT ON THE FAMILY MEDICINE TRAINING PROGRAMME 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

Page 8, Para 3, Line 3

“Dr Goh gave the House an idea of how the postgraduate training in Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) worked. The informed that there were 2 course of directions to take”. 3.2.8 REPORT ON THE FINANCE COMMITTEE 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

Page 9, Para 1, Line 3

“He added that with each deficits, withdrawals had to obtain from the Fixed Deposits”. The amended sentence “He added that with each **deficit**, withdrawals had to **obtained** from the Fixed Deposits”.

3.2.10 REPORT ON THE FOURTH SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

Page 9, Para 2

“The Annual Report for 1992-1993 and the various Council Committees Reports were proposed by Dr Alfred Loh and seconded by Dr Kwan Kah Yee”. The amended sentence should read as “The Annual Report for 1992-1993 and the various Council Committees Reports were proposed by Dr Alfred Loh and seconded by Dr Kwan Kah Yee **and adopted by the House**”.

7 FELLOWSHIP BY ASSESSMENT

Page 11, Para 1, Line 9

“(iii) Service to community through teaching, research and voluntary work”. The amended sentence should read as “(iii) Service to community through teaching, research and **voluntary relevant** work”.

REPORT OF THE FOURTEENTH COUNCIL 1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994

- 4** The meeting went through the various Committee activities for the Annual Report 1993-1994 as follows:

Chairman told the House that the activities in the Report of the Fourteenth Council 1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994 was self-explanatory.

4.1 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CENSORS 1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994

The House congratulated Dr Goh Lee Gan on his recent promotion to Associate Professor in the Department of Community, Occupation and Family Medicine, National University of Singapore.

Assoc Prof Goh informed the House the results of the Second M. Med (Family Medicine) examinations held from 11 July to 16 July 1994. Out of the 11 candidates who sat for the examinations, there was one failure. This rate of success had helped to dispel the myth of the examination quota. What the School of Postgraduate Medical Studies was concerned with was the standard of the candidate's performance in the examinations.

The House was informed that Assoc Prof Goh would continue with the Advanced Training in Family Medicine programme under the auspices of the College.

He further reported that the entry requirements for the M Med (Family Medicine) training for Family Physicians were 4 years in general practice and 2 years of supervised training. The supervisors would be someone with working knowledge in Family Medicine and with proven track records.

The House debated on whether the College's Fellows and Diplomate members should continue to use the titles "FCGP(S)" and "MCGP(S)". It was agreed that the Censor-in-Chief would seek legal advice from the Honorary Legal Advisers on the use of the old titles, "FCGP(S)" and "MCGP(S)" or the new titles "FCFP(S)" and "MCFP(S)", which are in line with the College's new name.

4.2 REPORT OF THE CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE 1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994

Chairman apologised for the absence of Dr Richard Ng Mong Hoo, Chairman, CME who was away. The CME Committee was commended for being active in its continuing medical educational programme, and for working well with other medical organisations to promote CME. Chairman would like to see more hands-on practices on CME.

Dr Soh briefed the House that to date, there were 156 doctors who had been awarded the SMC-CME recognition award certificates for the programme period 1 July 1993 to 30 June 1994. He also informed the House that 206 doctors had paid to be on the programme with 52 previously registered doctors carried forward from the Singapore Medical Association (SMA). On paper, Dr Soh said that it would appear that most doctors had participated in the programme, but in reality, it was not. Dr Soh had expressed concern that a vast sum of money has been spent on the programme but the rate of participation was small.

**4.3 REPORT OF THE FAMILY MEDICINE TEACHING PROGRAMME
1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994**

Assoc Professor Goh informed the House that the Ministry of Health would be having 15 MOH trainees for Family Medicine at a time. Dr Soh suggested that FMTP participants be given Certificates of Attendances at the end of the course. Dr Lee Suan Yew said that this would give a wrong signal to the participants as they (the participants) would need to attend the FMTP course leading to the M Med (Family Medicine) examination.

The House had agreed to give Gold Medals to outstanding candidates in the M Med (Family Medicine) examination.

**4.4 REPORT OF THE UNDERGRADUATE TEACHING COMMITTEE
1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994**

In April 1994, a mentor scheme for the undergraduates was set up. This scheme had provided favourable feedback from the undergraduates.

**4.5 REPORT OF THE RESEARCH COMMITTEE
1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994**

Dr Lee Kheng Hock, Chairman, Research Committee said that the results for the 1993 One-day Morbidity Report had been completed. It would be published in the October/December 1993 issue of the Singapore Family Physician journal.

The results of the survey on family values conducted by the College on its members was submitted to the Ministry of Community Development. Some of the ideas from our survey were incorporated in the Singapore Family Values document. A report on the survey findings will be given to every member when it is ready.

**4.6 REPORT OF THE PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE
1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994**

Chairman apologised for the one year (1993) backlog for the Singapore Family Physician journal. He suggested that Dr David Lim assist Dr Vaswani to clear the backlog by the next three months. Chairman assured the House that by the next AGM, the publications would be up-to-date.

**4.7 REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE
1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994**

The Finance Report was presented to the House. The House commended both the Honorary Treasurer, Dr Arthur Tan, and the Administrative Secretary, Joanne Yap, for the prudent expenditure. It was the first time that the College had seen a surplus of S\$34,286.00 in its account.

Dr Tan said that inspite of the increase in income, there was no decrease in the College's services for its members and there were no increase in course fees for its members too.

4.8 REPORT OF THE PRACTICE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE 1 April 1993 to 31 March 1994

In line with recent Managed Healthcare System (MHS) with the NTUC, the Practice Management Committee had hoped to draft a set of guidelines/protocols on "Practice Guidelines in Primary Health Care". It had also done a survey on Clinic Quality Assurance in Primary Health Care Services and the results would be published in the College Mirror.

The Annual Report for 1993-1994 and the various Council Committees Reports were proposed by Dr Lim Kim Leong and seconded by Dr Leong Vie Chung and adopted by the House.

5 AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1994

- 5.1** The House went through the audited accounts for the year ended 31 March 1994. The House suggested that the gold medals from "VLF" Fellowship Fund would be given to outstanding M Med (Family Medicine) graduands with distinctions.
- 5.2** Dr James Chang suggested that the accounts on page 35 of the 'Fixed Assets' for year 1993 and 1994 be tabulated side-by-side for easy comparison.
- 5.3** The wordings "No depreciation is provided for painting and pottery as the former appreciates in value and the latter will be replaced as and when the need arises" should be deleted. This was because the pottery items in the Lounge had been given to the College and not on loan. The House was informed that both the painting and pottery had been insured.
- 5.4** The accounts for the year ended 31st March 1994 had been proposed by Dr Leong Vie Chung and seconded by Dr Lee Suan Yew and adopted by the House.

6 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- 6.1** Chairman informed that the House that the Committee of the Postgraduate Medical Library, which is currently jointly managed by the College and the Academy of Medicine, Singapore, had suggested that the two organisations shared in the expenditure for the Postgraduate Medical Library. Alternatively, the Academy of Medicine, Singapore may take over the entire management of the Library.

Chairman felt that the College's past Presidents, Dr Lee Suan Yew and Dr Koh Eng Kheng had put in a lot of effort to source for sponsorships and funds to have the Postgraduate Medical Library to build the Postgraduate Library as it is today. On the suggestion of sharing costs with the Academy of Medicine, Singapore to run the Library, it would be difficult for the College as the College do not have adequate funds.

The House had agreed that the College would jointly manage the Library, without any financial commitment as long as it could. Chairman was concerned with the role the Postgraduate Medical Library could play in the future as most

restructured hospitals, such as, the Singapore General Hospital, Tan Tock Seng Hospital and Toa Payoh Hospital are in the process of setting up their individual postgraduate resource centres. This being so, the Library could become redundant in the future.

- 6.2** There being no further matters, the meeting ended at 5.05 pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

2 COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

2.1 SMC-CME Programme

The College's Secretariat has been administering the SMC-CME Programme efficiently and without any financial deficit. However the response from non-College members and Academy of Medicine, members has been poor. Only 250 doctors have registered for the 1994/1995 programme.

2.2 Advanced Specialty Training Programme for Family Medicine

A Memorandum was submitted by the Board of Censors to Council for an Advanced Specialty Training Programme (AST) leading to the award of the Fellow of the College of Family Physicians Singapore (FCFPS). Council has discussed and approved the proposal. It is proposed that the programme commences in July 1995.

2.3 Visits to the College by :

2.3.1 Dr Giora Almagor, WONCA Chairman of Council and Convenor of WONCA China Task Force on Wednesday, 20 July 1994

Dr Giora Almagor, WONCA Chairman of Council and Convenor of WONCA China Task Force met Council members for a discussion on 20 July 1994.

2.3.2 Dr David Garlick from University of New South Wales on 19 October 1994

His visit was to explore whether our Family Physicians are interested in taking a Diploma or Master course on sports medicine in Australia.

2.3.4 Dr James A Dunbar, Downfield Surgery, United Kingdom on Sunday, 23 October 1994

His visit was to co-organise CME activities with College for both College members and members of his proposed study tour group to Singapore and Malaysia in January 1996.

2.4 “Living Wills”

College was invited to submit its views on “Living Wills” by the National Medical Ethics Committee. Subsequently, a dialogue session on the proposed legislation on “Living Wills” for medical organisations was held on 19 November 1994. College was represented by Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan and Dr Soh Cheow Beng.

2.5 Advertising Guidelines

The Singapore Medical Council has requested Council’s views on a proposed set of guidelines on the ethics of advertising and the use of signboards and nameplates by doctors. Council deliberated at length on these guidelines and has submitted our views and recommendations to the SMC.

2.6 Postgraduate Medical Library

The future of the Postgraduate Medical Library was discussed by its Committee on 21 March 1995. The majority of members was in favour of closing the Postgraduate Medical Library in view of poor utilisation and high operating expenses. The closure of the Library is however subjected to approval by both Academy of Medicine, Singapore and College’s general membership.

The resurgence of interest in Family Medicine amongst our undergraduate has been overwhelming. Since the Ministry's recent emphasis on quality primary health care and the introduction of structured, post-graduate training, our medical students have shifted focus from specialty training to Family Medicine. In fact, the undergraduates, themselves, selected the topic "Prospects of Family Medicine in Singapore" for their Career Talk 1994.

This was organised by the Medical Society, NUS, and our panel of speakers: Dr Alfred Loh, Dr Lee Suan Yew, AP Goh Lee Gan, Dr Lim Kim Leong and Dr Bina Kurup, covered a wide range of topics. The students proclaimed the event "a resounding success". Three hundred of them took the time to attend and participate in the discussions.

Perhaps the most obvious indication of a growing interest in Family Medicine can be seen in the growing number of applications for post-graduate training.

- 1988 - there were 9 applicants. All of whom were accepted for post-graduate training in Family Medicine leading to M Med (Family Medicine)
- 1992 - There were approximately 60 applications of whom 24 were accepted.
- 1994 - There were 70 applicants, of whom 32 were accepted.

With this in mind, we would like to encourage more of our members to come forward as tutors.

We would like to thank and acknowledge those of our colleagues who have given much of their time and effort to teaching.

It is hoped that this database will provide us with useful information on the profile of Family Physicians and the status of Family Medicine in Singapore. Such information may also be helpful in planning and allocating resources for research, vocational training and continuing medical education.

In the present climate of concern over rising health care cost and the resurgence of interest in Alternative Medicine which does not follow scientific conventions, the future tasks of the Committee may be increasingly challenging.

Continuing with our policy of prudent financial management which was well executed by our Administrative Secretary (Miss Joanne Yap), we were able to increase our gross income 1.7 times while maintaining our expenditure at about the same level.

While income from subscriptions and entrance fees were reduced by \$5,722, we were able to increase our income from advertisements, rental charges and administrative charges (derived from the organising of joint activities) while hedging our core activities (including the FMTP) against any losses by obtaining sponsors. We were also able to run the SMC-CME profitably.

Our gross income for this financial year is \$290,988, an increase of \$124,035 hence the excess of income over expenditure is \$154,462 as against \$34,286 last year. This has allowed us to increase our fixed deposit from \$572,000 to \$720,462.

The administrative staff must be complimented for their tireless effort at fund raising and ensuring that fees are levied and paid on time. As we increase our net wider, our source of new ground can only shrink while our existing sources begin to deplete. Hence an already uphill task of maintaining our profitability will become ever more difficult.


