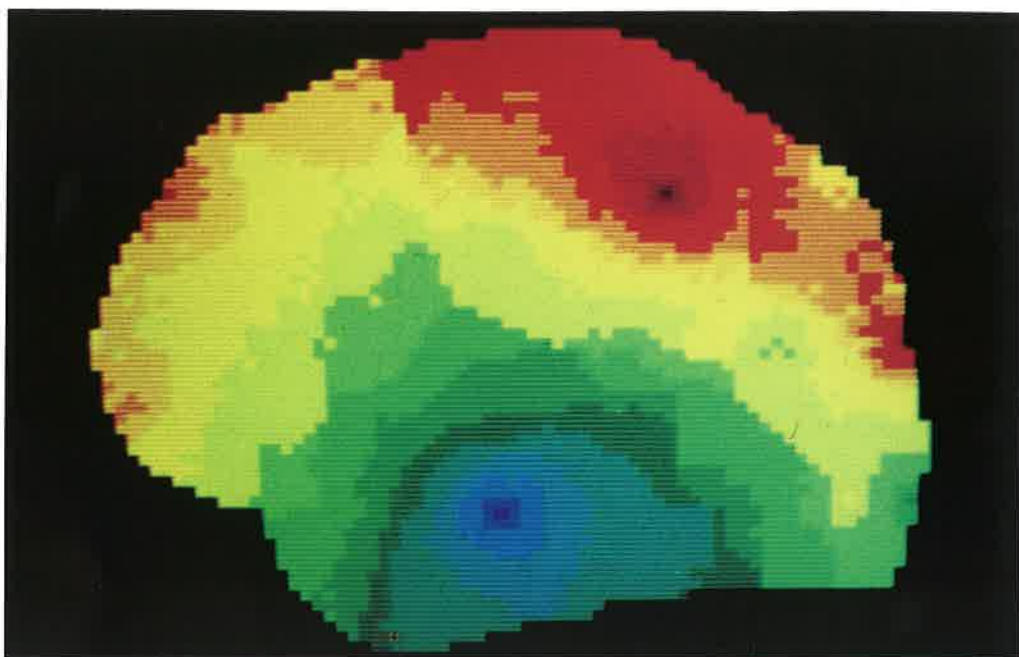

The President called the meeting to order at 3.00 pm. There was no quorum at 3.00 pm and the President announced that the meeting would be rescheduled at 3.20 pm in accordance with the Constitution. The meeting was called to order at 3.30 pm.

OPENING REMARKS

In his opening address, Chairman welcomed an observer, Dr Henry Hancock from Australia. Chairman informed the House that the year 1994 was an uneventful one. He was happy to note that the younger set of Council members were able to blend themselves well with the senior members. Chairman had expressed his appreciation for the Council's support for the past year.

The House was informed of a new mandate from the Postgraduate School of Medical Studies, NUS, to the College on the Advanced Specialty Training in Family Medicine for M.Med graduands. The Postgraduate School of Medical Studies, NUS, had written to the College to give permission to the College to formulate and do the Advanced Specialty training as its exit training. The Censors Board had prepared a Memorandum on Advanced Specialty in Family Medicine and had submitted it to both the Postgraduate School of Medical Studies and the Ministry. The Censors Board would be starting a Fellowship by Assessment programme in July 1995.

The College would continue to conduct the Continuing Medical Education (CME) as its mainstream activities. He thanked Dr Richard Ng and his Committee for their good efforts in keeping the CME to be the mainstream of the College activities. Chairman also informed the House that the voluntary SMC-CME programme was still being administered by the College Secretariat for both the specialists and family physicians regarding their continuing medical education (CME).

The House was informed of the following various College's sub-Committee activities and the College's representations with other government bodies for the past year :

Undergraduate Teaching Committee

The Undergraduate Teaching Committee continued to work closely with the Department of Community, Occupational and Family Medicine, (COFM), NUS in taking the undergraduates on their clinical postings in Family Physicians' Clinics. The College's senior doctors conducted several family medicine lectures to the undergraduates.

Family Medicine Teaching Programme (FMTP)

The Family Medicine Teaching (FMTP) modular programme were conducted on Saturday afternoons at the College premises. Chairman was pleased of the increase of trainees, both from the government and those in private practice.

Advanced Training in Family Medicine Committee, Postgraduate School of Medical Studies, NUS

Dr Lim Kim Leong, the past Censor-in-Chief represented the College in the Family Medicine Committee of the School of Postgraduate of Medical Studies, NUS.

National Medical Ethics Committee

The President of the College was a member of in the National Medical Ethics Committee.

SMC Ethical Codes & Advertising Guidelines

The College was invited by the Singapore Medical Council (SMC) to give their views on the Medical Ethical Code and Advertising guidelines and Signboards for doctors. The College's President also represented the College in the Medicine Advisory Committee, a Committee which looked into registration of drugs for sale in Singapore.

Postgraduate Medical Library

Dr Soh Cheow Beng, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan, Dr Koh Eng Kheng and Dr Alfred Loh were representatives in the Postgraduate Medical Library Committee.

SMC-CME Committee

Dr Soh Cheow Beng and Dr Richard Ng were representatives in the SMC-CME Committee.

Finance

Chairman informed the House that the financial position of the College was healthy for the past year. He commended both the Honorary Treasurer, Dr Arthur Tan and the Administrative Staff, especially the Administrative Secretary, Ms Joanne Yap. There was a credit balance of S\$154,000 compared to S\$34,000 in the past year. This will allow us to have more activities that will benefit the membership.

1 MINUTES OF THE 23RD ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON SUNDAY, 27 JULY 1994

The following was amendment to the Minutes was adopted:

Page 6, Para 3.2.8, Line 3

Report on the Finance Committee 1 April 1992 to 31 March 1993

To add the word 'be' after the word 'to'. The amended sentence should read as "He added that with each deficit withdrawals had to be obtained from the Fixed Deposits".

The adoption of the minutes was proposed by Dr David Lim Hock Kuang and seconded by Dr Lawrence Ng. There were no objections.

2 MATTERS ARISING

Chairman introduced Dr Henry Hancock, a doctor from Australia who was attending as an Observer in our 24th Annual General Meeting.

The meeting went through the Matters Arising out of the Minutes.

Chairman informed the House that the Singapore Medical Council (SMC) has given approval for the College's Fellow and Diplomate members to use the new titles "FCFP(S)" and "MCFP(S)". Members were advised not to use both titles at the same time. For example, if a Fellow has been awarded with both titles, such as the "FCFP(S)" and "MCFP(S)", he/she could use "FCFP(S)" only because both the titles are of the same entity.

The Publications Committee had put in extra effort for the last three months to clear the outstanding issues of the 1993 and 1994 issues. It was reported that the outstanding issues of October/December 1994 and January/March 1995 would be out for circulation soon. By June 1995, the Publication Committee would have caught up with the backlog of issues.

Chairman was concerned about the future of the Postgraduate Medical Library. This was because all restructured hospitals had set up their own libraries for teaching purposes. The present utilisation of the Postgraduate Medical Library was small. The future of that Library will need to be decided.

3 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FOURTEENTH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

3.1 REPORT OF THE FOURTEENTH COUNCIL 1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

The Report of the Fourteenth Council for the year ended 31 March 1995 was presented.

Dr Wong Heck Sing was glad to see some new Council members to the College's Council. Chairman introduced the following new and older Council members to the House :

3.2 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CENSORS

1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

In the year under review, Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan informed that there was 616 members. He reported that the College lost 2 members, Dr Goh Mye Meng and Dr Heaslett E. Arthur, through death.

On the second Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) examinations held last year in July, the two external examiners were Dr Niel Spike and Prof Stuart Murray. Out of the eleven candidates, there were ten successes. As compared with the first M.Medicine (Family Medicine) held in 1993, this success rate was higher, which was based on the standard achieved, rather than on the quota system.

Members were informed that there is discussion under to offer to the **Advanced Specialty Training (AST) in Family Medicine** programme. This is a 3-year programme completion of the Master of Medicine (Family Medicine). The idea of the AST in Family Medicine programme will parallel the other Master of Medicine disciplines such as the Medicine, Paediatrics, Surgery, O&G and other disciplines. There was a debate as to whether Family Medicine who have completed be considered a specialty or not. Also, would the doctors who have completed the AST programme in Family Medicine be allowed to charge more. It is likely that doctors who have completed Family Medicine training will be older to look after more complex problems and justify higher fee because of more time being needed in managing these patients.

The Advanced in Family Medicine programme has of three areas. The first area should be on "updating of the professional knowledge", that is, Continuing Medical Education in critical reading and research activities. The second area is on "Practice Skills" in the region of development, clinical records, clinical organisations, and thirdly, service to the community and to the profession.

There would be a mentor scheme, whereby the senior members in the Board of Censors would function as supervisors to the participants of the Advanced Family Medicine programme. In July 1995, the College would be only taking about 5 to 10 candidates for a start.

Associate Professor Goh mentioned the M. Medicine (Family Medicine) Private Practitioner Stream (PPS), which would commence in July 1995 with 5 supervisors managing each a team of 5 PPS trainees. This stream was designed for doctors who had gone out in the family practice early. Unlike the MOH trainees, who would be on a 3-year programme, with 2 years of rotating hospital postings and 1 year in the outpatient setting, the PPS trainees would need a total of 6 years in family practice, with the last 2 years under supervision. Each supervisor would supervise 5 trainees at a time.

The PPS trainees would need to undergo a weekly tutorial (about 50 tutorials in a year), a monthly workshop and a posting to a district hospital. The training would be more practice-based with clinical

cases in the practice as the study materials and a posting to district hospitals. For this year, the trainees would be posted to the Toa Payoh Hospital and Alexandra Hospital to hone their psycho-motor skills in the Eye, ENT. For next year, it would be in Internal Medicine, Paediatrics and others.

The House was informed of the forthcoming 3rd M.Medicine (Family Medicine) examinations to be held in the 1st two weeks of October 1995. The two external examiners would be Prof Nigel Stott from the United Kingdom and Prof John Sangster from the University of Western Ontario, Canada.

Finally, Associate Professor Goh mentioned on the training of the clinical teachers. He said that the FMTP Trainers Group had been functioning for about 2 years. This group had met and exchanged ideas and teaching materials for the M. Medicine trainees. Associate Professor Goh also mentioned that the Asia Pacific WONCA Working Party on Education will be conducting a 3-day Clinical Teachers Workshop in Macau from 15-17 June 1995. Five doctors from Singapore, namely, Dr Bina Kurup, Dr Chan Nang Fong, Dr Cheong Pak Yean, Dr Wong Song Ung, and with Associate Professor Goh, the Organiser, in this Workshop.

Both Dr James Chang and Dr Wong Heck Sing commended Associate Professor Goh's contributions in Family Medicine training.

Dr Wong felt that graduands of M.Medicine (Family Medicine) and the Advanced Specialty Training in Family Medicine programme could be now termed as "Specialists" as in the American and Australian systems. He said that if we wait for the correct timing set by the Ministry for the abovementioned graduands to be called "Specialists", then the momentum would be gone and forgotten. Regarding the specialists' fees chargeable, Dr Wong felt that the fees should be left to the public to decide on the doctors' worth and also, by market force.

In reply, Dr Alfred Loh, the Chairman said that the new Council would deliberate on Dr Wong's views. The Council could perhaps bring the views to the relevant bodies. However, Chairman would like to continue with the present good tripartite relations (the College, the NUS, School of Postgraduate Medical Studies and the Ministry) on issues of the postgraduate training.

Dr Wong Song Ung voiced an observation that previously the MCFP(S) examination was conferred by the College and graduands are of the College's fraternity. He said that he was one of the few 'experiments' for the M.Medicine (Family Medicine) which he had found to be useful. However, Dr Wong observed that most of the M.Medicine (Family Medicine) trainees and graduands are not College's members. This might lead to a cut-off in socialisation with the College and that the M.Medicine (Family Medicine) programme would no longer be the College's activity.

3.3 REPORT OF THE CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE 1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

Chairman said that doctors were more attracted to CME as upgrading of their skills. He hoped that the new CME Committee would have more hands-on Workshops and Seminar sessions for our members.

3.4 REPORT OF THE FAMILY MEDICINE TEACHING PROGRAMME
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

Associate Professor Goh said the FMTP programme was a dictatic teaching programme, which was a 2-year, part-time course, held on Saturday afternoons at the College premises. The FMTP Committee would like to further develop the teaching materials systematically into readable notes.

3.5 REPORT OF THE UNDERGRADUATE TEACHING COMMITTEE
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

Dr Lim Lean Huat reported on the Undergraduate Teaching Committee's activities and thanked members who taught in the Undergraduate GP posting programme.

3.6 REPORT OF THE RESEARCH COMMITTEE
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

Chairman hoped that the Research Committee would embark on research projects. There are funds available but there were no takers so far. At this juncture, Dr Wong Heck Sing informed the House that as research is the life blood of any discipline, the College should take up the challenge seriously. He further mentioned during his term as President of the College, the College was granted tax relief status for research purposes.

Chairman agreed with Dr Wong Heck Sing that as College is an academic body, we must do some research. He hoped that the new Research Committee would arise research activities.

Dr James Chang said that though there were research topics to do, most doctors were not trained in the research methodology.

Dr Lee Kheng Hock agreed with what was said regarding the obstacles faced about research. He said that interest and commitment in research work must be high. He added that for the past 2 years, the College had conducted 2 research works. One was on "Hypertension" and half way through the study, it was terminated because of very poor response. The second research was on "Survey on Family Physicians' Attitudes Towards Family Values" was poor too. Dr Lee said that the part of the Research Committee's plan to conduct courses on the use of computers in research so that doctors could analyse data on their own.

3.7 REPORT OF THE PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

The outstanding issues of the Singapore Family Physician journal for 1993 and the last issue (October/December 1994) would be out for circulation soon. Dr Vaswani hoped that by the end of year 1995 our publications would be very up-to-date. He thanked those who had helped him and his Publication Committee to clear the backlog.

3.8 REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

The Report of the Finance Committee was adopted.

3.9 REPORT OF THE PRACTICE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE
1 April 1994 to 31 March 1995

The Report of the Practice Management Committee was adopted.

The Annual Report for 1994-1995 and the various Council Committees Reports were proposed by Dr James Chang and seconded by Dr Huan Meng Wah and adopted by the House.

4 AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1995

4.1 Chairman said that though the subscription income had decreased, the income received were mainly from the rental charges of the College's Lecture Theatre Nos 1 and 2 and also from administrative activities provided by the College Secretariat to various medical organisations.

4.2 Dr Richard Ng would like to know what was the item "Sundry Income". The Honorary Treasurer replied that it was the administration fees for the College's running of the CME courses for the whole Financial Year.

4.3 The accounts for the year ended 31 March 1995 had been proposed by Dr Huan Meng Wah and seconded by Dr Lau Hong Choon and adopted by the House.

6 ANY OTHER MATTERS

6.1 Postgraduate Medical Library

Members were informed that when the College of Medicine Building was refurbished in 1987, the Ministry of Health had agreed through the Permanent Secretary of Health, Dr Kwa Soon Bee that both the Academy of Medicine, Singapore and the College would occupy the first level wings of the Building and jointly managed the Postgraduate Medical Library on the Mezzanie

level. The past Presidents of the Academy of Medicine, Singapore and the College, Dr Lee Suan Yew and Dr Koh Eng Kheng had worked very hard to fund the two million dollars fund for the Postgraduate Medical Library, which was known as a "Journal" Library.

- 6.2 In the past, the Postgraduate Medical Library was fully utilised by doctors for Journal readings and also for its Med Line services. However, with the restructured hospitals having its own resource centres, the utilisation of the Library was now very poor. The Library Committee met and was still considering whether the Library be allowed to operate at a loss of S\$250,000 per year.
- 6.3 Dr Alfred Loh, being the alternate Chairman of the Postgraduate Medical Library, had proposed to the House that should the Library Committee decided to cease operating the Library, then the College would like to use half of the donated fund of S\$750,000 to expand the College's library, to be known as the College's Postgraduate Library in Family Medicine with the merger of the present Reuben Meyer Library.
- 6.4 The House was agreeable with Chairman's proposal on the formation of the College's Postgraduate Library in Family Medicine. Dr Wong Heck Sing proposed and Dr Moti H Vaswani seconded and adopted by the House.
- 6.5 Chairman informed the House that with the Minister of Health's visit to the College on 25 July 1995, the subject of renewing the College's tenancy with the Ministry would be brought up.

There being no further matters, the meeting ended at 5.30 pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

THE SINGAPORE FAMILY PHYSICIAN

We are pleased to report that the Journal is now up to date, thanks to the untiring effort of the previous Committee. In particular, we acknowledge the contributions made by the immediate-past Chairman, Dr Moti Vaswani, as well as Associate Professor Goh Lee Gan.

The problems that plagued the old Committee, namely the dearth of articles and the lack of advertisement revenue, however, remained. Possible reasons for the want of contributions to the Journal could be :

1. The lack of recognition of the SFP as a scientific journal of merit, and
2. The lack of interest of the Family Practitioner fraternity in intellectual pursuits.

In an effort to improve the credibility of the SFP, the Committee had commenced a peer-review system for all free papers submitted. This would bring the SFP a step nearer towards applying to be included in the Index Medicus, which is recognised internationally.

“Charity begins at home”. Therefore we would urge all Family Physicians with an interest in writing to support our own home-grown Journal with their contributions, whether these be review articles, case reports or other writings. Who are best suited for the continuing education of the Family Physician but the experienced Family Physicians themselves?

It is hoped that the coming year will see the beginning of the SFP growing steadily in credibility and gaining recognition as a Family Medicine Journal of merit both locally and in the region. This would require the support of all the members in the College, as the effort of the Committee alone would not bring this to fruition.

The College continued to face stiff competition in many facets of its activities and this was reflected in the accounts for this year.

Nett income for this year fell sharply to S\$ 60,349, a 39% decrease from S\$ 154, 462. Gross income was slightly reduced from S\$ 290,000 to S\$ 258, 645 while overall expenditure rose from S\$ 136, 526 to S\$ 198, 296.

Factors which influenced the outcome of the accounts were as follows :

- 1 While there was an increase in income from the collection of subscription by S\$ 30, 160, largely due to the relentless effort of our Administrative Secretary, a loss of S\$ 1,000 from the collection entrance fees (from S\$ 1,300 to only S\$ 300 this year) reflected a sharp decrease in the numbers of new members recruited for the year.
- 2 An extraordinary amount of S\$ 35, 340 was expensed in this year's account for the previous Scientific Conference.
- 3 The cost of production of two years publication of the Singapore Family Physician, our quarterly journal which had backlogged since last year and the publication of which was accelerated this year. This amounted to S\$ 24,029 while publication cost for the previous years was only S\$ 2,150.

In line with our prudent financial policy, a total of S\$ 68,584, was transferred into our fixed deposit account for this year.

As predicted by the previous Finance Committee, the maintenance of the College and its varied activities will become arduous with the ever decreasing financial resources.

The Chairman of the Practice Management Committee represented the College in the Medical Standards Working Group of SISIR. This group was tasked to form a Standards Committee on Medical Technology in SISIR, and had representatives from Ministry of Health, SMA, SDA, TDB, EDB, etc. The Committee will in turn set standards for all medical equipment to be used in Singapore.

This Committee also organised a visit to the Medical Classification Centre, Central Manpower Base of the Singapore Armed Force on 6 March 1996 to familiarise our doctors with pre-enlistment medical screening and the new PES grading system. A second visit was planned on 14 March 1996 but was cancelled due to poor response. However, the SAF have agreed to release guide on the new PES classification system to be distributed to all College members later.

We will also be working with the Medical Corps of the SAF to review their drug list in the medical centres.

The College has also been invited to nominate some of our members to be on the Board of Visitors to the SAF medical centres.

A survey of the needs of our members in areas of practice management will be conducted through the College newsletter soon.


